**“Courts should protect juror privacy...consistent with the requirements of justice and the public interest.”**

**What info is collected for jury service?**

**I. Administrative (for summoning):**

- ❖ Social security #s?**
- ❖ Basic qualifications (age, citizenship, etc.)**

**II. Personal stuff (during selection):**

- ❖ About family, employment, education...**
- ❖ Experience with justice system**
- ❖ Connections to this case, injury, conflict, loss...**

**“Courts should protect juror privacy...consistent with the requirements of justice and the public interest.”**

- **Who has access to juror information?**
  - ✓ Parties, lawyers, court personnel, jury consultants
  - ✓ Interested observers, the public at large
  - ✓ The media
- **When/where are juror disclosures made?**  
**In writing? In open court?**
- **How long will juror info be retained?**
- **Are jurors informed about what happens to their disclosures?**

- **Testimony & Exhibits**
- **Media Attention**
- **Duration of the Trial**
- **Relations with Other Jurors**
- **Personal Matters Outside the Case**
